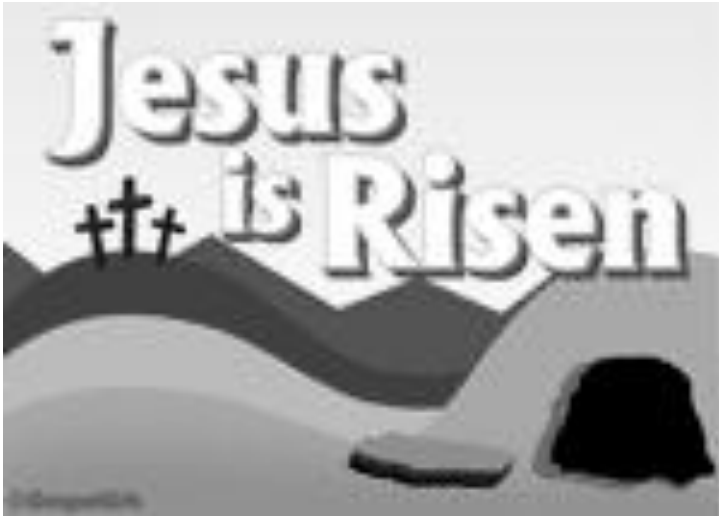

# MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

We have recently had the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Charles Darwin who was born on 12<sup>th</sup> February 1809. Earlier this year I read a short book called, "Rescuing Darwin: God and Evolution in Britain today" by Nick Spencer and Denis Alexander. This book tells us that Darwin was an active Anglican and studied theology with a view to entering the Church of England ministry. However, he never entered the ministry but instead went on a five years expedition to South America and the Pacific to study nature.

Darwin always had a rational and logical faith and over the years his doubts grew. But it was the suffering and death of his young daughter Annie which eventually destroyed his faith and turned him into an agnostic. Annie suffered ill health for a long time and eventually Darwin saw her waste away and die.

Suffering is probably the greatest obstacle to faith and especially when it is what we sometimes call "innocent suffering". This is particularly so when such suffering directly affects our own lives.

In February 6 years old Ivan Cameron, the son of the Conservative party leader, David Cameron, and his wife, Samantha, died. Ivan was born severely disabled with a rare illness. This meant that he had to have continuous care and support and involved frequent visits to hospital. I have followed the story mainly on radio and in my newspaper. It has been said that it has changed David Cameron making him a better person. It has made him a much stronger supporter of the National Health Service and brought him into contact with a far wider variety of people. I have not heard about how it has affected his religious convictions but I assume it will have made him think about and question more the existence of a loving God.

Certain questions are always with us. Why does an almighty and loving God allow suffering? Why do some good people seem to suffer and some bad people seem to prosper? Does God really care for his world and his people? There is not a complete answer to these questions here on earth but I am sure we need to say something about this subject of faith and suffering.

We are now in the season of Lent and approaching Holy Week and Easter when we remember the suffering, death and resurrection of God's only Son, Jesus Christ. The Christian belief is that God became man in Jesus Christ entering fully into human life, its successes and failures, joys and sorrows, good and bad times. When Jesus was arrested, put on trial, whipped and put to death on a cross God directly experienced human injustice, pain and death. This does not explain why we suffer but it does show that God has shared our suffering and understands it first hand. I find it easier to believe in such a God rather than in a God who always stands apart from human life and suffering.

Three days after Jesus had died and been buried God raised him to life. In so doing God's love triumphed over the human injustice and sin which crucified Jesus and over death itself. The resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the basis of our own belief in the life after death. Jesus said to his disciples, "Because I live, you too will live" (John 14:19). The resurrection shows us that injustice and suffering do not have the last word, but rather God's love is ultimately victorious. This is our faith in Christ.

May the love and peace of God be with you all. David.

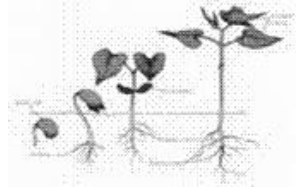

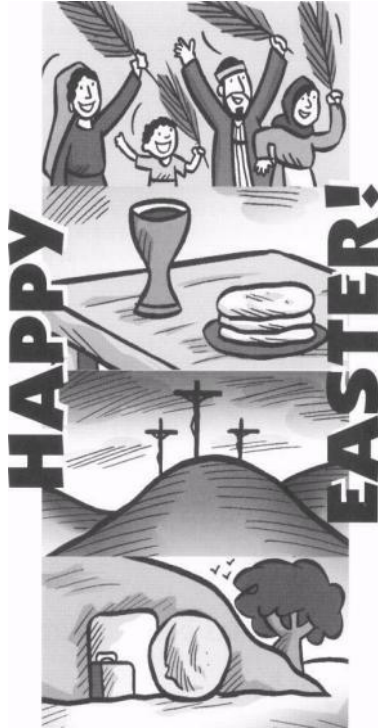
# GOOD FRIDAY

## **3<sup>rd</sup> Enfield Boys' Brigade update February and March 2009**

The last few weeks have been quite busy for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Enfield, and have included members taking part in various London District competitions.

On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> February, the Solo Bugle, Solo Drum and Solo Bell Lyre competitions were held at the headquarters of the 10<sup>th</sup> Ealing Company, Kingsdown Methodist Church. Andrew Clarke took part in the Solo Drum competition for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Enfield, and after a great performance won his competition, in doing so becoming the first London Solo Drum champion from the 3<sup>rd</sup> Enfield since 1989. A total of 11 people entered the Solo Drum, 8 in the Solo Bugle and 5 in the Solo Bell Lyre.

Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> March saw the 3<sup>rd</sup> Enfield once again join with the 1<sup>st</sup> Enfield for the London District Band competitions, held at the home of the 1<sup>st</sup> Enfield at Lancaster Road United Reformed Church. The combined band took part in the Devonshire Cup, which is the main competition for bands in London, and the Don West Trophy, which involves performing a set test piece and being judged on musical accuracy. The band was second in the Devonshire Cup (to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Bromley) and won the Don West Trophy, which is a very creditable performance for what was generally speaking a young band.

Our next competitions are the London District Drill and Colours, which will have taken place by the time you read this, on 28<sup>th</sup> March at Felden Lodge. We also have our Annual Display and Presentation Evening on 27<sup>th</sup> April, members going to Firm Foundations in May, an Enfield Battalion Junior Section Weekend Camp in June and our Summer Camp with the 10<sup>th</sup> Enfield in July/August. Once again, some busy times ahead!

## a consultation at pentecost

### what is vision2020?

- A new programme of mission planning that will begin after General Assembly 2010 and will be designed to integrate with the Vision4Life 'evangelism' year and develop beyond that
- It will challenge the church to think about mission priorities at national, Synod and local levels
- It will build a shared commitment to mission across the URC.

### vision2020: your views

- During Pentecost 2009 we are seeking the views of local churches on **vision2020**
- In early May, every church will receive a discussion booklet giving more details of the plans
- Churches are encouraged to discuss the ideas for **vision2020** in small groups, church meetings or church services as part of Pentecost activities. There is a menu of possible activities – some lasting 90 minutes, others just ten
- There will be opportunities to find out more and to respond on the URC website
- There will also be opportunities for further discussion at Synod meetings later in the year.

**WHAT:** Pilots are a group for boys and girls aged five upwards. They meet for games, drama, craft activities and fun, based on a bible theme.

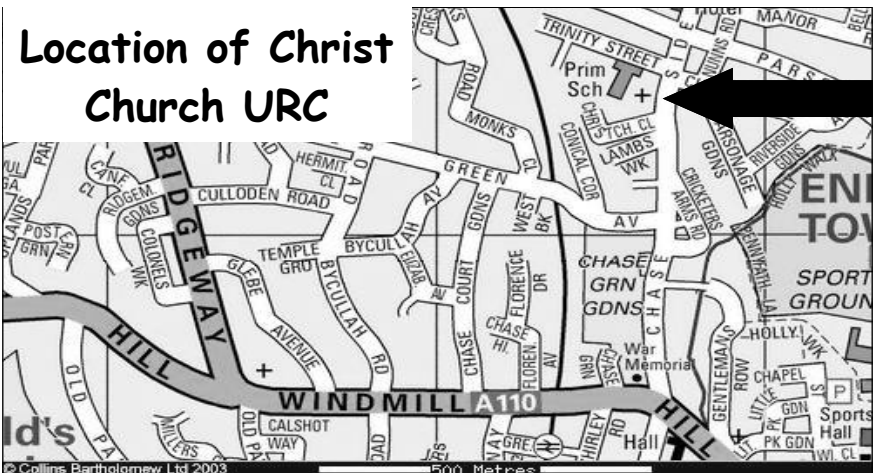
