### **MINISTER'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

A group called "Action for Happiness" was launched on 12<sup>th</sup> April and got into the national news. One of the speakers at the launch was TV presenter, Sian Williams.

The aim of the group is to boost the net amount of joy in the world by being kind to others and countering "an epidemic of loneliness and isolation".

Professor Richard Layard, head of the well-being programme at the London School of Economics said, "Despite the fact that we are getting richer, after 60 years we still haven't managed to produce a happier society. We are asking people to produce more happiness and less misery."

At the launch one of the group stood cheerily on the pavement holding aloft a sign offering "Free Hugs". People who attended the launch wore signs such as, "Love more" and "I'm up for more happiness".

The movement's supporters say it is not just about fluffy slogans. It requires members to set up action groups to promote happiness wherever possible: at work, at home and in the community. On 12<sup>th</sup> April the "Action for Happiness" website collapsed under the weight of users.

There is evidence that the happiness movement is being taken seriously in high places. Last year David Cameron told a conference that it was time "we admitted that there's more to life than money". He added, "It's time we focused not just on GDP but on GWB - general wellbeing".

In November 2010 the government asked the Office of National Statistics to produce measures to gauge "general wellbeing". France's President, Nicolas Sarkozy, has declared his intention to include happiness and wellbeing in France's measure on economic progress.

Happiness and joy have a significant place in the Christian faith and life. But this is not because Christians are called to make personal happiness and joy a primary aim in life. Rather happiness is a bi-product and consequence of other aims.

For example, if we try to do God's will or care for someone in need or show forgiveness to someone who has wronged us or work for peace then a consequence for us can be personal fulfilment and joy. We aim to love and serve God and other people and in the process God blesses us with joy.

Sunday, 12<sup>th</sup> June is Whit Sunday or Pentecost when we celebrate the giving of God's Spirit to the disciples (Acts chapter 2, verses 1-4). Paul tells us that one of the fruits of the Spirit is joy (Galatians chapter 5, verse 22). As we worship and pray to God and put our trust in him and as we love and serve God and other people God blesses us with an inner spiritual happiness and joy.

I welcome the group, "Action for Happiness". But I want to add that those who practise the Christian faith share happiness with others and experience happiness for themselves.

May the love, joy and peace of the Spirit of Christ be with you all. David




