

MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

For the second successive year I have been a Lea Valley District Council representative at the United Reformed Church General Assembly which this year met at Manchester University. Assembly began with opening worship at which the new Moderator, the Reverend Doctor Stephen Orchard, preached about the bible. We also received local, national and international ecumenical guests and guests from other faiths. The Moderator of the Church of Scotland and the Muslim representative addressed Assembly.

Our Sunday morning service included a bible study by the Reverend Roberta Rominger and an offering for the Ministry with Children Department of the Church of North India which raised £1,854. We received 18 new ministers of whom 11 were women and 7 men. Then we honoured ministers celebrating the Jubilee of their ordination i.e. their ordination was 40, 50, 60 or 70 years ago. 19 Jubilee ministers were present and 18 out of the 19 were men. These days a far greater proportion of ministers are women.

The most difficult and potentially contentious issue was about homosexuality. We have just ended a 7 years moratorium on this issue in which feelings have been allowed to calm down and an opportunity has been given for further reflection. We accepted a report that acknowledged there are still strongly and sincerely held opposing views. Some believe that homosexual practice is contrary to biblical teaching and should not be sanctioned in the church. Others believe that homosexuality is God given and homosexual practice in a loving and faithful relationship is perfectly acceptable. Therefore, we need to do some further study, discussion and prayer on the issue to discover God's will and the right way forward.. The whole subject was handled in a sensitive and caring manner.

The "Vision 4 Life" idea was explained to us. It is to encourage churches and individual Christians to do three things: to read the bible, pray and talk about God to other people.

We commemorated the Bicentenary of the Act to Abolish the Slave Trade. The Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Gospel Choir led us in some moving songs. We were told about the terrible evil and brutality of the slave trade in which 10 to 12 million Africans were captured, transported to America and sold as slaves. At least $1\frac{1}{4}$ million of these slaves died before reaching America. The slave trade was carried out by white people from western European countries and we were shown a picture of a chapel where they worshipped which was directly above a dungeon where the slaves were kept in appalling conditions.

The National Rural Officer highlighted the plight of farmers. In the recent flooding some farmers have suffered very badly. One farmer lost 400 sheep and others have had their crops ruined. On a general note United Kingdom consumers pay less for their food and non-alcoholic drinks than consumers in any other European Union country. We need to exercise the principle of fair trade towards British farmers and pay them a fair price for the food and milk that they produce.

I found the most interesting Assembly paper was on Assisted Dying. This is a very difficult and complex area and Assembly agreed we could not support legislation that allows medical staff deliberately to assist a person to die. I was among a small minority who questioned this view. I said to Assembly, "Jesus said that he came to give people life in all its fullness. If someone is terminally ill, in great pain and distress and it is their wish to die is it wrong to assist their dying? They hardly have life in all its fullness in this life but may receive that life in the life after death."

I have many papers from Assembly and if anyone wishes to read any of them please ask me. I found the most interesting were about Assisted Dying, Homosexuality and the Heritage Lottery Fund. We were also given a booklet of leaflets which explains the Nature, Faith and Order of the United Reformed Church.

As always for me an enjoyable part of Assembly is to meet people whom I have known in previous years but not seen for some time. I was particularly pleased to see the Reverend Cyril Lucraft who preached at my Induction Service at Bark-ing U.R.C. in 1979 and helped me with my ministerial training when I was in Hackney in 1974. Cyril was at Assembly celebrating the 50th anniversary of his ordination.

This letter only touches very briefly on a few aspects of General Assembly but I hope it gives you a flavour of Assembly. I am grateful to the Lea Valley District Council for asking me to be one of their representatives and to both Christ Church and Lancaster Road for encouraging me to go.

Past, present and future

Part 2 - 20th and 21st Centuries

Following the retirement of Rev Storer Toms, Rev Dr John James, a talented artist, became minister in 1906. He was succeeded by Rev. Ebenezer Rees, who served for 30 years from 1916 to 1946 and as minister emeritus until his death in 1966. Members from Christ Church served in both world wars and during the first world war were active on the local war Refugees Committee caring mainly for the Roman Catholic Belgian refugees. Ebenezer Rees helped to establish of the Enfield Preservation Society in 1936, later becoming its president and was also chairman of the governors of Enfield Grammar School. Christ Church has had a long musical tradition and in 1937 at the instigation of Vincent Evans, the church organist and choirmaster, the Young People's Society of Christ Church was established with choral, dramatic, orchestral and social sections. From the choral section developed the Christ Church (now Enfield) Choral Society. Following the sale of the British Hall, the present Church hall was built next to the church in 1939.

In 1947 Rev Leonard Towers became minister and moved into a manse in Waverley Road, the previous manse having been let as a nurses' home. His wife Alice started the Friendship Club, initially for young mothers for whom a crèche was also provided. In 1947 the present monthly newsletter was started. In 1948 Little Church was set up for children attending the morning service. In 1960 Little Church was united with the afternoon Sunday School to form the Junior Church and Will Hummerstone became its first Warden. For many years children and their teachers took part in the annual scripture Examination organised

by the Sunday School Union. Following the death of Ebenezer Rees, Leonard Towers was made minister emeritus.

Rev. Vivian Buddle was inducted in 1960 and during his ministry he encouraged a number of young people in the church to become members. In 1961, following the discovery of serious structural problems, the Lecture Hall was demolished and in 1964, following a fund raising campaign, the main church roof was replaced and the spire was repaired. In 1965 Vivian Buddle left Christ Church to become a religious knowledge teacher.

In 1966 Rev. Kenneth Faulkner came to Christ Church with his wife and children, who were to play an active role in the life of the church, particularly in the choir. Later in 1966 the Congregational Union of England and Wales was replaced by the Congregational Church. Having failed to obtain the required majority in 1971, in 1973 Christ Church joined the United Reformed Church (which was formed from a union of the former Congregational and Presbyterian Churches). In 1975 Christ Church celebrated its centenary with a re-enactment of the original opening, an exhibition on its history organised by Donald Potter and a dinner and social evening.

Following the departure of Kenneth Faulkner, Rev. Roy Martin became our minister in 1980. He brought to Christ Church his experience of working for many years in the Church of South India and his pastoral care was particularly appreciated. Following Leonard Towers' death Roy Martin was appointed minister emeritus.


In 1988 Rev. Adrian Bulley (who was later to become moderator of Wessex province of the URC) accepted a call to the pastorate of Christ Church and moved with his family into the newly acquired manse in Churchbury Lane. Several younger families became actively involved in the life of the church and

groups for mothers and toddlers and making banners were set up. In 1991 Chris Willis was ordained as a non-stipendiary minister and served as associate minister at Christ Church until 1993.

Following Adrian's Bulley's resignation in 1993, Christ Church received valuable ministerial leadership from several interim moderators and three short term interim ministers who were able to bring to Christ Church the benefit of their experiences in other countries - Rev. Joe Pratt 1994-6, who had previously served in the Church of South India, Rev. Egland Graham 1999-2001, who came originally from Jamaica and Rev. Alan Abraham from USA, who we shared with Lancaster Road and Ponders End URCS. In 1995 the Church Parlour and Ladies Vestry were demolished to provide access to the care home built on the site of the former manse behind the church.

Since 2004 Rev. David Atkinson has been minister of Christ Church and Lancaster Road URCS, living in the Christ Church Manse and normally conducting the morning communion and family parade service at each church. The worship group has produced many new ideas which they incorporate into the service they conduct each month. Other morning services are led by local lay preachers and retired ministers. Special services are held at the church festivals and recent popular innovations have included a Christingle service and Chase Side School carol concert held since our minister established links with the school. The church is also used for services and concerts by various other organisations

The hall originally had a stage and productions have included many amusing musical works by 'Will Kinlock' such as 'The Battered (sic) Bride' performed by members of the choir and plays and sketches by adults and young people including members of the uniformed organisations.

Musicals performed by young people, have included 'Greater than Gold' and 'A Grain of Mustard Seed' and Joseph and his Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. The hall has also been used for social occasions and bazaars (sometimes with participants in period costume) and has been regularly used by sporting groups such as the Badminton Club, Friendship Club, Sunday School and Little Church (and later Junior Church and Pilots) youth clubs and uniformed youth organisations - Boys Brigade, Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Rangers. When the hall is not required for church related activities lettings provide a useful source of income as well as serving the community.

Proposals for unions with St Paul's and later Trinity churches, as well as plans for closer links between Methodist and United Reformed Churches in Enfield and Edmonton did not come to fruition; but Christ Church is developing its relationship with Lancaster Road URC with joint praise days, a Bible study group and elders days. It is hoped to establish closer links between all URCs in the borough. We also take part in services with other Christians in the North West Enfield Neighbourhood Group of Churches.

Christian outreach has included Edith Mills and Sylvia Coombs serving in India and the Solomon islands and we have financially supported Christian Aid, Shanthigramam home in India, Goldie College in the Solomon Islands, The Bible Society, Crisis and Cheviots home in Enfield.

This year our Every Person Challenge group has challenged us to go for growth through helping the poor and disadvantaged overseas by supporting a Church of South India project, to go for growth in our Church fellowship through a church day and to go for growth through prayer and Bible reading.




