## Pastoral Letter March 2020

Has the gospel message reached your bank account yet? Jesus met up with a young man. He approached Jesus. Came up to him and asked a question. He was searching for peace, for answers to the emptiness that, deep down in his heart, was present in his life. He recognised Jesus was someone special. "Good Teacher", he called him.

There was some discussion between them, about what commandments were important to follow.

The discussion still left the young man feeling empty. He had done everything that the religious leaders had recommended. He kept on performing in the way in which he had understood he should behave, always doing the **right** thing, always doing the **good** thing.

But he was still empty inside.

There was a spiritual hunger deep within, a yearning for truth, for peace, for goodness... and he thought that Jesus would have the answer to that hunger that he had.

But he wasn't expecting what came next - it was a big surprise to him.

And it remains a big challenge to the church in 2020, and to each one of us as individuals.

It affected something close to our hearts, sadly, something close to his heart on that day when he met Jesus.

"If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." (Matthew 19:21)

Nobody had mentioned money in this way before. Nobody had spoken about possessions in the way that Jesus spoke about possessions.

### "Give it all away."

He could not handle at that time what was said to him. The gospel record states that "he went away sad, because he had great wealth" (Matthew 19:22).

Did he later reflect and change his mind? Did he sell up and follow Jesus?

He may have done - that may be the reason we have the story. But at that moment in time, just then, he struggled to face up to what he was being asked to do.

The challenge though, still remains, not just for that young man but for us as well.

That's why we pose the question that we ask at the top of the page - has the gospel message reached your bank account yet?

Because... if Jesus asked that one young man to sell all he had and give to the poor, does he not also ask us the same question? Give up what you have, what you possess, and come and follow me.

As we consider our own lives we find ourselves challenged by Christ's words consistently. We are able to live very comfortably and we wonder whether, actually, what we need to be thinking about when we hear Christ's words is whether we need to work on an excuse as to why we haven't sold all our possessions and given the money we raise to the poor... and then been able to truly follow Jesus?

Can we truly say we are followers of Christ if we give Jesus no

influence over what we use our money and possessions for?

It has been said that Jesus isn't interested in how much you give - to church, to charities, to others - that lesus wants to look at what you have left after you have given.

The widow gave little in monetary terms into the temple treasury but Jesus praised her:-

"I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything - all she had to live on." (Mark 12:43, 44)

If you're wondering how to respond to the gospel message this Lent, if you're interested in following Jesus, then let the gospel message affect your bank account this year.

One way that you can do that is to pick up one of the "Count Your Blessings 2020" booklets which are available in our churches, produced by Christian Aid.

It's a booklet designed to encourage you to think carefully about what you have... and to give in response to what you read there. It provides opportunity to pray, to reflect, and to engage with the wider issues that we as a race, the human race, should be facing up to as we live our lives.

It's a booklet that does what it says on the tin... encourages us to count our blessings.

Why don't you join with us in doing that this year through Lent.

May God bless you richly as you do.

# **Boys' Brigade update**

Towards the end of January we held a Quiz Night to raise funds for the Company. It was fantastic to see the hall packed with over 90 people and we are delighted to report that a total of £842 was raised. Thank you everyone for your support!

On Monday 3rd February our Juniors, Company Section and Seniors took part in a Crystal Maze Live Experience. The event was run over four evenings by Enfield Battalion and hosted by 10th Enfield at Winchmore Hill Baptist Church.

Teams took on eight games with physical, mental and skill based challenges, with the aim of gaining as many crystals as possible. These crystals gave the teams time in the Crystal Dome at the end of the evening, where they had to try to collect as many gold tickets as possible.

Our two teams in the Juniors age group came tenth and eleventh, with the Green team (5 crystals,







72 gold tickets) just edging out the White team (5 crystals, 66 gold tickets). Congratulations to 1st Barnet, whose Purple team came in first place out of 14 teams.

We also had two teams in the Company Section and Seniors event. They also came tenth and eleventh, with the Red team (also including members of 1st Enfield) collecting 7 crystals and 91 gold tickets, and the Green team collecting 4 crystals

and 89 gold tickets. 10th Enfield's Red team were the winners, coming first out of 18 teams - well done to them!

Over 180 young people took part across the four nights and we'd like to say a huge thank you to all those who were involved in planning and running the event.

On Saturday 15th February we took part in the North London Badminton competition at the Old Drill Hall. Our team in the Under 15 age group came third (won by 1st Barnet), and we are proud to say that our two teams in the Open age group came first and second for the second year in a row! Well done to all who took part and thanks to those who organised the event.

# **Looking for Befrienders**

We are pleased to say that we will shortly be joined in Enfield by another family under the Government's Resettlement of Refugees scheme. As a result of this we are looking for more befrienders to help. If you're interested in becoming a befriender please let either Mark or Melanie know or contact Alan Seldon by email at alan.seldon@voneus.com.

A role description is given below:-

### Role of befriender

The role of the befriender is to work with others in the befriending team to help a Syrian family to adjust to life in a new country, offering valuable support to ease the process.

### Your tasks

- Showing newcomers where to find local amenities
- Delivering practical assistance, such as help to buy clothing and essential items.
- Accompanying newcomers to official appointments
- Listening to concerns and worries
- Supporting and offering advice where appropriate or, with the befriending coordinator, finding the right service to help
- Responding appropriately to safeguarding and protection issues
- Working with an interpreter (training to be given)
- To receive regular supervision from the befriender coordinator, to whom the befriender will be accountable for their work with the family and receive support, advice and guidance.
- To receive periodic clinical supervision from the group supervisor. This will involve meeting with befriender colleagues, coordinator and the clinical supervisor to explore common themes in the work with the family and its impact.

### A befriender is

- A good communicator and empathetic about the situation of refugees
- Sensitive to cultural issues, including those relating to gender
- Able to use support skills in a calm and responsible manner
