

Pastoral Letter March 2024

Happy Easter everyone,

It's early this year and just manages to stay in the month of March.

Eastertime is a time for hope isn't it? The signs of Spring are evident as flowers push through their winter beds, stretching open for us all to enjoy their glorious colours. The sun does start to get warmer and the day light lasts so much longer than the winter months. Things do seem better when the sun shines. It's a time for some churches to dress crosses with flowers and then display them at the front of their church buildings. I remember when I was small we always had Easter bonnet competitions at school and of course the obligatory Easter egg hunt. Mind you, you are never too old for an Easter egg hunt, are you?

On 2 March this year it is the annual World Book Day when children go to school dressed as their favourite character from a book; or whichever character can be rustled up the night before. There's plenty of characters in the 66 books of the Bible that people could choose from too. Jonah with his big fish, Noah and his ark or Joseph and his colourful coat; the choice is endless. What is your favourite book of the Bible? Who would you choose to dress up as?

During Lent church groups get together to study the Bible and often use resources that either focus on a theme or one of the books of the Bible. The three churches in the North Enfield Pastorate are joining together to look at Holy Week over a five-week period on a Tuesday

evening (details are advertised further on in this newsletter). Everyone is welcome to join these times of study and discussion. We all too often can't wait to get to the joy and celebration of Easter without really looking at the lessons we can learn from those last days of Christ's life before his crucifixion.

Because of what occurred over 2,000 years ago, our Christian faith is built on our belief that Jesus went to the cross in our place to take the punish of death we deserve because of our sin.

"Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins to rescue us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen." (Galatians 1:3-5)

His glorious resurrection has given us the opportunity to invite him into our lives and turn away from the life we once led towards the life Jesus has promised us; an eternal life with him.

Recently I have been upheld by a song by We Are Messengers called *God You Are*. It has a beautiful chorus. For me these words remind me of the amazing love of God for us all and how safe we are in his embrace.

Pastorate Policies Workshop

Along with serving Elders and group leaders in the churches of the North Enfield Pastorate and others in the South and East Enfield and North Lea Valley Pastorates, I attended a workshop at Bush Hill Park URC on Saturday 3 February. It was led by the Revd Ruth Dewis, the Revd Martin Legg and Chris Marlow (an Elder at Lancaster Road URC).

The aim was to ensure that all churches were compliant with URC policy. Even though I am not a serving Elder or leader of a group of adults or children, I still found the day useful in understanding issues concerning security checks, safeguarding and fire safety.

In individual church groups we looked particularly at safeguarding. We were asked to ensure that our policy was legally compliant and that we followed good practice, we knew who was responsible for safeguarding and what to do if problems arose. It was suggested that, particularly for those who do not want to or who are unable to participate in individual online presentations, group sessions on safeguarding in front of a large screen would benefit group leaders and church members.

Jesus' Entry into Jerusalem

Matthew 2:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-40, John 12:12-19

The most famous works of the Florentine Early Renaissance artist Giotto (1266/7-1337) are his 1305 frescoes (painted directly onto wet plaster covered walls) in the Scrovegni or Arena Chapel in Padua, Italy, where they can still be seen today. They show events from the Life and Passion of Christ.

Jesus is riding on a donkey towards the city of Jerusalem, during the Passover Festival, which took place each year about the beginning of April. Many Jews came to the city at that time to celebrate the first Passover meal, before Moses led the people of Israel out of Egypt (Exodus 12). Christians celebrate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, a week before Easter Day.

Giotto shows people climbing trees to pull down branches and taking off their cloaks to lay at the feet of the donkey Jesus is riding. The people are also singing praises to God. To save paint, the precious blue pigment on Jesus' robe was applied when the plaster had dried and much of it has since flaked off. Behind Jesus his disciples have haloes, to show that they are saints.


the Revd Eddie Boon, the Synod's Discipleship Enabler.
